MP JOINS CAT HILL PROTEST



In November, David Burrowes MP attended the 67hr protest against the development of Cat Hill.

David said "I am acutely aware that my constituency owes its name to the Southgate of Enfield Chase. I am therefore pleased to fight for the retention of our local environment and heritage. The proposed development is out of character and an over development. Sixty seven felled trees and a six storey development is unacceptable and should be rejected next month by the Planning Committee. I pay tribute to the dedicated campaigners who care not just about their backyard but the local environment which is all our back yards."

MP CALLS FOR JUSTICE FOR GARY MCKINNON

With Gary in his 10th year of challenging his extradition, David called for reform of extradition laws. He said "Lessons need to be learned from Gary's case. Court's need to have greater oversight of cases so they can consider whether it is in the interests of justice to extradite a UK citizen. The Home Secretary also has an important role to safeguard human rights. I hope that Gary Mckinnon is the last living example of why the extradition laws were reformed not a dead example of why we failed UK citizens."

DAVID BURROWES WALK ABOUT WITH DEPUTY MAYOR

This month, David Burrowes took the opportunity to show Cllr Daniel Moylan, Deputy Mayor responsible for TfL, outstanding issues concerning the A406 and transportation to Chase Farm and North Middle sex Hospitals.

David Burrowes said "I was pleased to show Boris' right hand man on transport key issues affecting my constituents. As we reach the final phase in the A406 improvements I was keen for the Deputy Mayor to see what still

needs to be done. Together with Cllr Lamprecht and local residents we raised the need for more trees and plants to improve the environment, a safer junction at Hastings Road, clearer signage and improvements to Powwows Lane junction. We also pressed the case for an extension to the 318 bus service to make North Mid hospital more accessible. Finally we shared the concern that under Ken Livingston's plans to cut bus fares, bus services in Enfield would be cut."



BURROWES WELCOMES GOVERNMENT ACCEPTANCE OF 'ENFIELD'S LAW'

In response to the level of serious knife crime in Enfield local MPs Nick de Bois and David Burrowes have been leading a campaign to extend mandatory sentences for knife crime to under 18 year olds. The Justice Secretary Ken Clarke has now jointly signed with Nick de Bois and David Burrowes an amendment to the Legal Aid Sentencing and Punishment Bill in Parliament this month.

David Burrowes said "I am pleased that Ken Clarke has responded positively to the case Nick and I made to him and agreed to our amendment. We made the point that a clear message must be sent to young people of the seriousness of carrying knives. Our amendment means that if you threaten someone with a knife you should expect to go to prison and if you are 16 or over you must go to prison unless there are exceptional circumstances. This law is being introduced in direct response to our representations on behalf of Enfield; it is Enfield's law".
