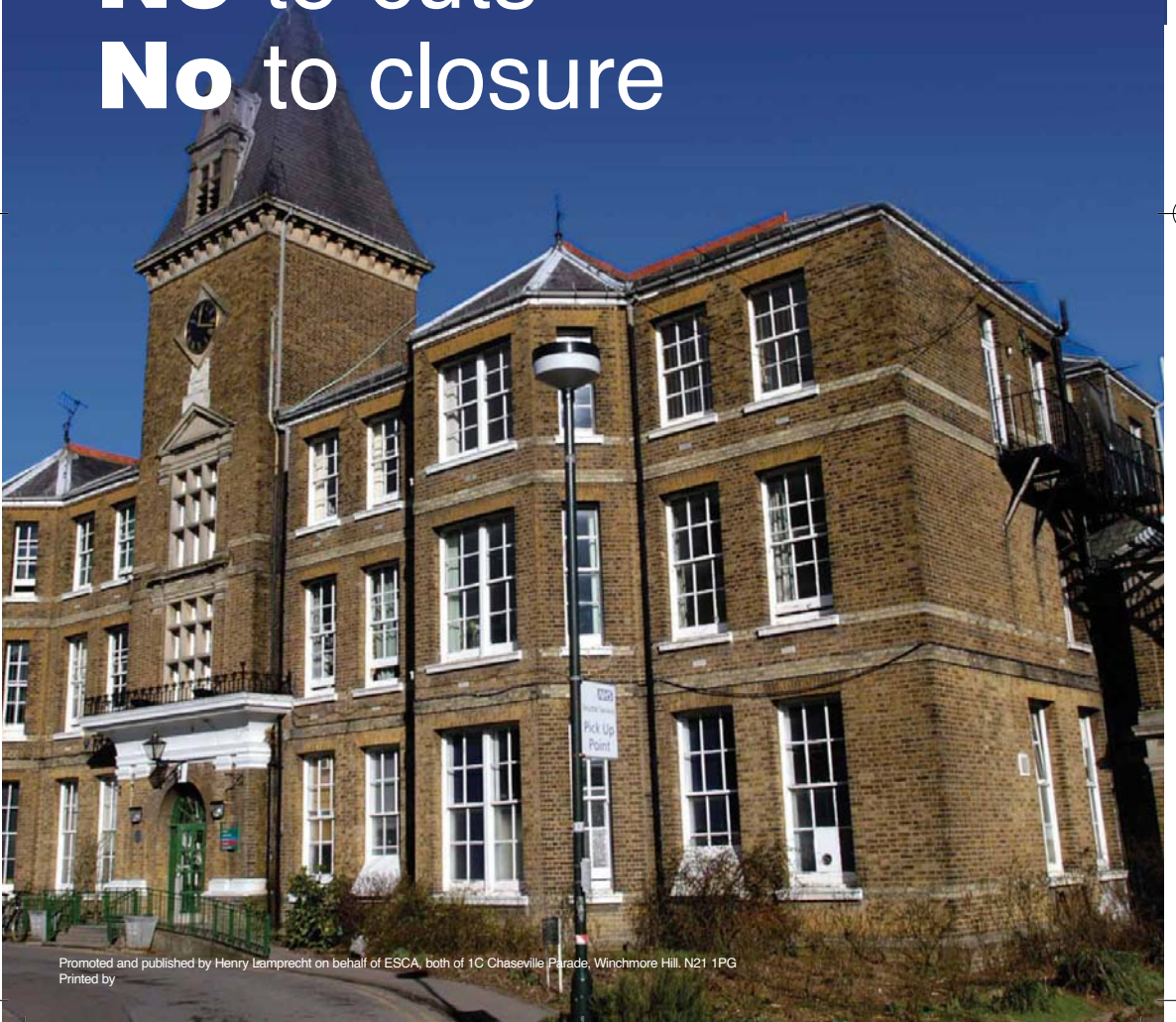

Hands Off Our Hospital!

There is little time left to make our voices heard about the closure of Chase Farm Hospital services. Across the country, hospital departments are being closed, or – as is the case with Chase Farm – whole hospitals are in danger of being closed. The Government is committed to closing local hospitals in order to save money and specialise services.

Hemel Hempstead and Welwyn are about to lose their A&E and maternity units and Chase Farm is next on the list. Highlands is a close reminder of how a general hospital is downgraded to a community hospital and then ends up as a housing development.

As local people, this is our last chance to keep our hospital open, providing the full range of services we need. We have to let the Government and its health bureaucrats know how strongly we feel.

There are three things we can do: If you agree with us and thousands of Enfield residents, that Chase Farm Hospital should not be decimated by cuts in services or outright closure,
